Access to Health Services

- Students in Gainesville may access health services through the Student Health Center Satellite Office in Room D2-49 on the second floor of the Dental Tower (Office hours Fall/Spring: M-F, 8am-5pm (closed 12-1pm); Summer: M-F, 8am-4:30pm (closed 12-1pm)) or the Student Health Center on the upper campus (280 Fletcher Drive) (Office hours – including Pharmacy, Lab and X-ray: Fall/Spring: M-F 8am-5pm, Sun 12-4pm; Summer: M-F 8am-4:30pm). After normal business hours, students should seek care in the Emergency Department.
- Students in Jacksonville may access health services through UF Community Health Center, which is located in the Ambulatory Care Center building, 4th floor, Jacksonville campus. Prior to presenting for care, please contact the office to arrange for a time to be seen. You will be given an appointment with one of several providers, and every effort will be made for you to be seen the same day you call. However, depending on provider availability and clinic patient volume, a next working-day appointment may be necessary for late-day contact. For your convenience we offer a streamlined appointment system manned by our registered nurses. To schedule an appointment, call one of our clinic nurses at either (904) 244-5673 or (904) 244-2573. In the event both of these lines are busy, we suggest you wait 10-15 minutes and call again. If still busy, or if you do not wish to wait, call our main appointment line at (904) 244-5121 and press 1. In either case it is important that you identify yourself as a UF medical student needing Acute/Urgent Care. Clinic hours of operation are Monday through Thursday 8am-5pm, and Friday 8am-3:30pm. We are closed for all UF holidays. Your health insurance company will be billed for the visit, including any ancillary services such as laboratory tests, X-rays, or specialty consult. You will not have any out of pocket expense.
- At both sites, students should clearly identify themselves as College of Medicine students. Students will then be assigned to providers who play no role in evaluating or grading them.
